

Riviera Little League (RLL) bylaws edit or add to the current edition of rules from Little League Baseball, Inc. These bylaws are to be reviewed annually and are subject to change by a majority vote of the Board of Directors prior to the start of the regular season. All actions taken by RLL, its participants, and the Board Members must be in accordance with those regulations defined by Little League Inc. and/or the RLL bylaws.

1. President/ Board Selection

1. The Board of Directors (aka Executive Board) and Auxiliary Board (aka General Board) act as electors for the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors will consist of eleven positions outlined in section nine of these bylaws. Before the conclusion of the Spring season, the President should ask for nominees and form a ballot if more than one nominee is seeking a position. The electors shall then vote to determine those elected, proctored by the President, Secretary, and Information Officer.
2. Auxiliary Board positions are by appointment in consultation with returning Board of Directors members.
3. Auxiliary Board members missing 2 consecutive or 3 meetings throughout the course of the board year, without prior arrangement with the President or Secretary, are subject to removal from the board. In these instances, the Board will find a replacement and a Board of Directors vote will be placed.

2. Coach Selection

Coach selection and Assistant Coach approval for all divisions will be by the President in consultation with the Division Player Agent, League Player Agent, and Coach Coordinator. However, all appointments are subject to final approval by the Board of Directors.

3. Divisions and Division Rules

1. Division rules – establishes the rules, goals, and behavior for that division. Division Rules are approved by the RLL Board and published every year. The rules are distributed to the coaches at the Coach’s Meeting before the start of the season.
2. Riviera Little League consists of eight divisions:
 - T-Ball
 - International
 - National
 - Minor

- Intermediate
- Junior
- Challenger

Division	League Age Range	Special Requirements
Junior	13-14 League age August 31st	Mandatory evaluation and draft when forming 2 or more teams. After teams are formed, placement on teams will be at the Board of Directors' discretion. 12 yr olds and 7 th graders may play in the Junior division only by evaluation and at the discretion of the Board of Directors.
Intermediate	12-13 League age August 31st	Mandatory evaluation and draft when forming 2 or more teams. After teams are formed, placement on teams will be at the Board of Directors' discretion. 12 yr olds and 7 th graders may play in the Intermediate division only at the discretion of the Board of Directors.
Major	10-11-12 League age August 31st	Mandatory evaluation and draft. After teams are formed, placement on teams will be at the Board of Directors' discretion. 10 yr olds and 13 yr olds may play in the Major division only by evaluation and at the discretion of the Board of Directors. 13 yr olds cannot pitch in the Major Division.
Minor	09-10 League age August 31st	Mandatory evaluation and draft. After teams are formed, placement on teams will be at the Board

		of Directors' discretion. 8 yr olds and 11 yr olds may play in the Minor division only by evaluation and at the discretion of the Board of Directors. 11 yr olds cannot pitch in the Minor Division.
National	07-08 League age August 31st	Mandatory evaluation and draft. The Board of Directors may give a National player who does not try out a special circumstance situation. After teams are formed, placement on teams will be at the Board of Directors' discretion. 6 yr olds and 9 yr olds may play in the National division only by evaluation and at the discretion of the Board of Directors. 9 yr olds cannot pitch in the National Division.
International	05-06 League age August 31st	School and special requests honored. 7yr olds may play in the International Division only by evaluation and at the discretion of the Board of Directors.
T-Ball	04-05 League age August 31st	School and special requests honored. 6yr olds may play in the T-Ball Division at the discretion of the Board of Directors.
Challenger	04-Up League age August 31 st	

4. Evaluations

1. Mandatory for Junior and Intermediate Division players when there are two or more teams and all Major, Minor, and National players. Special circumstances

can be considered by the Board of Directors should the evaluation process be missed.

2. Uses a 10-pt rating as established by the Player Agent and approved by the Board of Directors prior to evaluations.

<u>Score</u>	<u>Comments</u>
9-10	Highly skilled player- Probable 1 st round draft choice.
7-8	Very skilled player- Probable high draft choice.
5-6	Average to good skill- Mid-round draft choice.
3-4	Moderate to challenged skills- Lower level draft choice.
1-2	Poses a safety risk to themselves. Should play a lower division.

3. Five categories are evaluated- Running, Infield fielding, Outfield fielding, Hitting, and Pitching.
4. The coaches, in addition to the applicable Division Player Agent and two Board members, will evaluate the scoring of coaches' children. The evaluating group will consist of at least three members from the Board not involved in that particular division.

5. Draft

1. The draft will be an open draft, identifying player name and score, with the coaches then selecting their teams.
2. The President, Vice President, and Division Player Agent as a group, can as needed by the division, make adjustments to the draft rating sheet in the interest of parity.
3. The minimum number of players per team for the Major Division is 11. The maximum number of players per team for the Minor Division is 12. If there are not enough safe Minor players for 11 person teams, they may have a minimum of 10 players per team.
4. Teams within each Division will have the same number of players, with players given priority based on their registration date. Any remaining players will be added to a wait list and placed on teams as seen fit by the Board of Directors.
5. Riviera Little League redrafts every year as there are no "property players."
6. Riviera Little League does not allow trades once coaches leave the Draft Meeting. All trades must be completed at the draft location the evening of the draft. Any and all trades made must be in consultation with the applicable

Division Player Agent and Board representatives running the Draft, before the trade is recognized by RLL.

- 7 Siblings qualify for the same team provided they meet the age/skill requirements of that division.

6. Playoffs

1. The Major and Minor Divisions shall play playoff games to determine a Division Champion. The Major and Minor Divisions shall play a double elimination playoff bracket up until the final Championship game, which will be a single elimination game. Second half of the season Riviera Little League rules shall be used for playoff games. Current pitching rules and any pitch count that goes past 51 or more will include a mandatory game rest plus any applicable days rest. Final standings determine the playoff game bracket seeding.
2. The National Division will compete in a single elimination playoff bracket. League officials will determine the seeding for playoffs. The seeding process will be modeled after the NBA Draft Lottery where each team will be awarded a ping-pong ball for each season win. League Officials will then blindly draw the ping-pong balls for seeding order. The more balls, the higher likelihood of getting a top seed. A coin flip before each game will decide the home team.
3. For Major and Minor seeding, in the event of ties, the following tiebreakers shall apply:
 - Team with the better head-to-head record shall be the higher seeded team.
 - If still tied, then the team with the higher run total head-to-head shall be the higher seeded team.
 - If still tied, then a coin flip will determine the higher seed.
4. The League Scheduler, in consultation with the Board of Directors, will establish and publish brackets as soon as practical at the beginning of the baseball season.

7. Incomplete Games

An incomplete game would be required to finish at the next available scheduling opening after the game was not finished for Major and Minor games only.

8. All-Stars

1. All-Star Committee

- The All-Star Committee will be formed by the Board of Directors and shall include:
 - President, Vice President, Player Agent, Information Officer, Coach Coordinator, and Divisional Player Agents.
- A member of the All-Star Committee cannot serve as an All-Star Coach. If a Board member holding an All-Star Committee position wishes to be considered for an All-Star Coach, the Board of Directors shall approve a Board member replacement.

2. All-Star Player Candidacy

- **ALL** Junior, Intermediate, Major, and Minor players will be required to complete the Player Commitment Form. All forms need to be signed and returned.
- Candidates must meet Little League age and residency (or school) eligibility requirements. Proof of eligibility will be required.
- Sportsmanship plays a major role in being on a RLL All-Star team. Poor attitude and behavior will not be tolerated and is reason to reject a candidate's nomination at the Board's discretion.
- All candidates must be available to play in all District 27 Tournament games. Players not meeting this commitment will not be qualified for the following year's All-Star team.
- A 9U player may elect to be considered for the 10U team. An 11U player may elect to be considered for the 12U team. However, a player can only fill out a Player Commitment Form for **ONE** All-Star team.

3. All-Star Player selection process:

- The League will have one All-Star team each for the Junior and Intermediate Divisions. The Major Division will have two All-Star teams – a 12U and an 11U team. The Minor Division will have two All-Star teams – a 10U (Team A) and a 9U team (Team B).
- Each team will have 13 rostered players and no alternates. The All-Star Coach has the option of adding a 14th rostered player to the team **before** the teams are finalized and announced.
- From the Player Commitment Forms, the All-Star Committee will compile ballots with a list of all eligible candidates by division and team.
- **ALL** players in the division will get a ballot to vote for up to 15 candidates for each All-Star team in their division.

- **ALL** Coaches and each team's two official Assistant Coaches will get a ballot to vote for up to 15 candidates for each All-Star team in their division.
- Instructions will be provided on the ballot and monitored and enforced by league representatives. Players will be allowed to vote for teammates and/or themselves if they wish. Coaches are not allowed to influence the player vote and will be subject to disciplinary action by the Board if caught. Coaches and Assistant Coaches are allowed to vote for their own child.
- All ballots will be reviewed for legitimate submission. No write-in candidates are allowed.
- The All-Star Committee will tally the votes from both the player and coach ballots separately and two lists will be formed with players ranked from the highest (most votes) to lowest.
- The top 15 players on the player list and the top 15 players on the coaches' list will move to the next round. All ties will favor the players.
- From the two lists, each division's coaches and the All-Star Committee will convene to determine the top 14 players. The elected All-Star Coach will then decide if they wish to keep the 14th player or have a 13-player roster. The decision to keep the 14th player must be made before the All-Star team is approved by the Board.
- Coach voting will be individual with no collaborative process amongst other coaches. Coaches caught colluding will be disciplined with action up to or including removal and disqualification as a coach at Riviera Little League.
- Final All-Star player rosters need to be approved by the Board of Directors.

4. All-Star Coach and Assistant Coach Selection Process:

- Candidates must be in good standing with the League, have excellent knowledge of Little League rules, be able to meet extensive time commitments, and have coached or assisted coached a team within the division that season.
- All coaches interested in coaching a Riviera All-Star Team will be required to fill out the All-Star Coach Commitment Form and return it to the All-Star Committee.
- The All-Star Committee will review the completed forms and approve all eligible candidates. During the All-Star player selection meeting, the All-Star Coach and two Assistant Coaches from this list for each All-Star team will be selected. Final All-Star coaches and assistant coaches need to be approved by the Board of Directors

5. The Board of Directors can correct gross imbalances to pre-announced All-Star teams and remove any player or coach for improper behavior or conduct deemed not in the best interest of Riviera Little League.

9. Administration

1. The Board of Directors, or voting Board, consists of the following eleven positions: President, Vice President, Safety Officer, Coaching Coordinator, Communications Manager, Secretary, Treasurer, Information Officer, League Player Agent, Fundraising Chair, and Snack Shack Supervisor.
2. The President and the Treasurer will annually file State and Federal Tax returns to maintain the league's 501(c)(3) status.

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
